What is an apprenticeship?



An apprenticeship is a paid job where you gain a qualification. Apprentices either work for several weeks and then spend a week in college/training, or they work four days a week and go to college one day a week.


Apprenticeship Levels...

NAME	LEVEL	EQUIVALENT
Intermediate	2	5 GCSE passes at grade A*– C or 9 – 4
Advanced	3	2 A level passes/Level 3 Diploma/ International Baccalaureate
Higher	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree

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
Importance of back-ups...

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The exception...



- If you apply for an apprenticeship with York College, and it falls through, they will
 put you directly onto a back-up course with them.
- You can apply for York College apprenticeships (with or without an employer) through the application section of their website.
- If you apply without an employer, the college will let you know if they find an employer for you – or they will decline the apprenticeship application and move you onto a back-up.

1 – Ask around

Find somebody who will take you on as an apprentices by asking friends and family, emailing your CV to companies, calling/visiting companies to ask if they have apprenticeship vacancies!






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

3 – Contact the Providers

Aswell as asking employers and applying for vacances. You can go directly to training providers who run apprenticeships. The main provider in York is York College, but there are others too!

The York, North Yorkshire and East Riding

Apprenticeships Hub has information on providers of apprenticeships and which apprenticeships they deliver.

You can find contact details for training providers and get in touch/visit their websites.

Some will ask you to apply (like York College), some will have vacancies, some might ask you to register. They will all be different, but they will all have their own way of keeping you in the loop!





How to find an apprenticeship...

After my apprenticeship...

After completing your apprenticeship, you could:

- Stay and work with the company.
- Move onto a higher-level apprenticeship.
- Take your qualification/training and work with another employer.
- Go to university (the route to university will vary depending on your level of training).

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What the world of work expects...

- Have an up-to date CV (you made one last year)
- Dress appropriately for any meetings/interviews, and make sure you are on time.
- Be friendly and professional with potential employers, smile and make eye contact where possible.
- Introduce yourself and be confident about what you can offer an employer; make sure you have researched the role/business thoroughly.
- Listen carefully to the employer, and put your phone away!
- Don't ignore the job description!


